

Introduction


The number of applicants has grown steadily at both the Public and Independent Colleges and Universities, although the Publics have grown at a higher rate. This trend is also consistent for those students admitted and enrolled as freshman.

In terms of trajectory and change, the largest year to year increases in admissions for the Public Colleges and Universities were between the years 2014 and 2015 (21.5%), and 2016 and 2017 (21.9%). The largest year to year increases in freshman enrollment for the Public Colleges and Universities were between the years 2012 and 2013 (6.0%), and 2016-2017 (13.6%).

The largest year to year increases in admissions for Independent Colleges and Universities were between the years 2008 and 2009 (18.0%), 2010 and 2011 (9.8%), and 2012 and 2013 (13.1%). The largest year to year increase in freshman enrollment for Independent Colleges and Universities were between the years 2009 and 2010 (10.5%).

While the Public Colleges and Universities and Independent Colleges and Universities have admitted a greater percentage of students versus the number of applicants, the conversion of admitted students into enrollees has declined over the last ten years. Enrollment as a percentage of applicants has declined by -4.0% at the Publics, by -1.8% at the Independents, and by -2.2% overall.

University of Connecticut - Application, Admitted and Freshman Enrollment - 2018



- The University of Connecticut-Storrs drives all the data for the University of Connecticut because of their size. Over the last 10 years, applicants at Storrs is up by 58.6%, admissions is up by 55.7% and freshman enrollment is up by 16.4%. The regional branches, as a collective, have seen applicants up by 559.3%, admissions up by 1,040.4% and freshman enrollment up by 371.5% over the last 10 years.
- University of Connecticut admissions as a percent of applications has grown by 6.5% over the last ten years while enrollment as a percent of applications has declined by -2.7%.

Connecticut State Universities - Application, Admitted and Freshman Enrollment - 2018



- Applicants at the Connecticut State Universities are up 36.8% in the last 10 years. This increase is led by Southern which is up by 60.5% over this time period.
- Admission of students at the Connecticut State Universities are up 51.8% in the last 10 years. This increase was led by Western which is up 64.1% over this time period as well as Eastern whom is up by 55.8%.
- Freshman enrollment has grown by 7.1% in the last 10 years. This increase is led by Central (13.7%) and Southern (22.0%), while Eastern (-0.8%) and Western (-11.8%) saw freshman enrollment decline.
- Connecticut State University admissions as a percent of applications has grown by 6.8% over the last ten years while enrollment as a percent of applications has declined by -4.8%.

National Non-Profit Independent - Application, Admitted and Freshman Enrollment - 2018



- Applicants at the National Non-Profit Independents are up 50.2% in the last 10 years. This increase is led by Yale who is up by 54.7% over this time period.
- Admissions at the National Non-Profit Independents are up 14.5% in the last 10 years. This increase is led by Connecticut College who is up 40.6% over this time period.
- Freshman enrollment grew at the National Non-Profit Independents and are up 11.6% in the last 10 years. This increase is led by Yale who is up 19.2% over this time period.
- National Non-Profit Independent admissions as a percent of applications has declined by -4.6% over the last ten years while enrollment as a percent of applications has also declined by -2.0%.

Regional Non-Profit Independent - Application, Admitted and Freshman Enrollment - 2018



- Applicants at the Regional Non-Profit Independents are up 31.8% in the last 10 years. This increase is led by Albertus Magnus who is up by 134.1% over this time period, followed by Quinnipiac, up by 64.3%.
- Admissions at the Regional Non-Profit Independents are up 45.5% in the last 10 years. This increase is led by New Haven who is up by 131.4% over this time period, followed by Quinnipiac, up by 71.5%.
- Freshman enrollment at the Regional Non-Profit Independents are up 16.5% in the last 10 years. This increase is led by Sacred Heart who is up 49.5% over this time period. Fairfield and Albertus Magnus are up 21.4%, and 19.9% respectively.
- Regional Non-Profit Independent admissions as a percent of applications has grown by 6.5% over the last ten years while enrollment as a percent of applications has declined by -1.3%.

Regional For-Profit Independent - Application, Admitted and Freshman Enrollment - 2018



- The Regional For-Profit Independent category is made up entirely by Post University since Lincoln College of New England and Paier College of Art do not report these measures.
- As can be seen from the table above, Post has grown exponentially in Applicants, Admissions, and Freshman Enrollment over the last 10 years.
- Regional For-Profit Independent admissions as a percent of applications has declined by -4.1% over the last ten years while enrollment as a percent of applications has declined by -8.1%.



- The Connecticut State Universities and Connecticut Community Colleges are mirror images of each other in terms of percentages of transfer-in students they enroll as a percentage of total enrollment.
- The University of Connecticut and Regional Non-Profit Colleges and Universities are very similar to each other with a lower percentage of transfer-in students enroll as a percentage of total enrollment.
- Regional For-Profit institutions (Post University) generally enrolled higher percentages of transfer-in students as a percentage of total enrollment, but their numbers have the greatest variability from one year to the next.

University of Connecticut Transfer-In Enrollment



Connecticut State University Transfer-In Enrollment



Connecticut Community College Transfer-In Enrollment



• Transfers as a percentage of total enrollment at the Connecticut Community Colleges, have grown slightly over the last ten years, increasing by a rate of 1.8%. This increase has been led by Asnuntuck Community College at 5.1%, followed by Housatonic Community College at 4.3% and Capitol Community College at 3.4%. Presently, no community college has enrolled fewer transfer-in students as a percentage of total enrollment than they did ten years ago.

National Independent Non-Profit Transfer-In Enrollment



Regional Independent Non-Profit Transfer-In Enrollment



• Transfers as a percentage of total enrollment at the Regional Independent Non-Profit institutions, have remained flat over the last ten years. Only Mitchell College and the University of Bridgeport have marginally increased the number of transfer students they have enrolled as a percentage of total enrollment, growing this area by 1.1%, and 1.6% respectively.

• Overall, transfers as a percentage of total enrollment Regional Independent For-Profit institutions, have declined by -13.4% over the last ten years. Paier College of Art is this only institution to increase the number of transfers they have enrolled over this period. However, it should be noted that from year to year, this small sector has the greatest variability from one year to the next.
